Little Red Riding Hood



- Our new story is Little Red Riding Hood. You will be able to
- find the story text on the Year 1 page on the school website.
- Try putting your own actions to the story and practise
- learning it off by heart with your grown-ups!
- Draw a picture of Little Red Riding Hood or a different character from the story and write a sentence using adjectives (describing words) to describe what they are like. Are they shy? Funny? Scary? Brave? Strong? You could even have a go at making some puppets. Your teachers would love to see this on your Class Dojo page!
- Now you have learnt the story, can you draw a story map of all of the key points that happen? Add keywords to your pictures and you use the example to help you. The beginning and last picture have been done for you.



Maths



- Over next few weeks, we will be focusing on multiplication and division. <https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/>
- **We will be starting with multiplication.**
- Start by learning how to count in tens. Look at the 10 times table. Does it have a pattern?
- Try your best to become fluent in the ten times table.
- Then, use this knowledge to start performing simple multiplication calculations. Talk about how the x (times) symbol means "lots of" or "groups of".
- 3×10 means 3 lots of 10. Draw three groups of ten dots to help you. Count them altogether and you will have your answer! Can you count in 10s to find the answer more efficiently? Three groups of dots are called an array! Try to keep your working out neat, as it will be easier to count.
- Once you've mastered this, try multiplying by 2 or 5. Also, try to solve multiplication word problems. For example, There are 5 bunches containing 10 grapes each in the shop. Max wants to buy 40 grapes. Are there enough?

Reading

- Look at the three different reading sheets and answer the questions about each of the texts.
- Remember use key words in the questions to help you find your answer.
- You can either read the texts online and answer in your exercise book or you can print the sheets off and have a go at answering them.
