 everything she passed along the way. Remember to add direction arrows and
 labels for key places that she passed. Eg. dark woods, wild flowers.

 Riding Hood and identify the noun. Then, write the same sentence again and up level it to include an adjective (describing word). Next, write this new sentence again but this time add a verb (a word to describe an action). Year 1 Sentence Workshop Example

Little Red Riding Hood is a girl (noun).

Little Red Riding Hood is a kind (adjective) and thoughtful (adjective) girl.

Little Red Riding Hood is a kind and thoughtful girl, who skipped (verb) happily to Grandma's cottage.

Little Red Riding Hood is a kind and thoughtful girl, who skipped happily (adverb) to Grandma's cottage in the dark woods.
