# **Lesson 1: Word Classes**

Today we are going to learn about the families that words belong to. These are called word classes.

You will need to do a little bit of reading first, then try the task at the end.

First, have a look at the table below – it explains some of the word classes and gives you examples.

## **NOUNS**

A word that **identifies a thing, a person or a place.** Any object is a noun!

Examples: computer, Norwich, apple, dog, school, shoes, England, William, hair.

Words like laughter, truth, happiness and others are special kinds of nouns – they aren't things that you can touch or see, but they are still 'things'. These are called abstract nouns.

## **VERBS**

These are known as 'doing' words – they describe what a person or a thing does.

Examples: run, singing, played, grow, raining,
Shouted, eat, write, become.

# **ADJECTIVES**

This is a word that *describes* a noun. It tells you something about it. In these examples, I have highlighted the adjective:

Norwich is a fine city.

Snow White ate the red apple.

My computer is fantastic.

Sonny is a beautiful, friendly dog.

## **ADVERBS**

These words give a bit more information about verbs or adjectives. Adverbs that end in ly often describe *how* something is done. Other adverbs can just give more information about a verb or an adjective. In these examples, the adverb is highlighted:

I carefully opened the present.
Liverpool often win their matches.
Jimmy laughed loudly at Harry's joke.

Some words can belong to different families depending on how they are used, like 'clean'.

The kitchen was very clean –used as an adjective to describe the kitchen.

I am going to clean the kitchen – used as a verb to describe what the person is doing.

We will look at more examples like this another time.
